- Be considerate and courteous to other golfers.

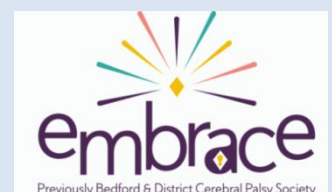
My charity for the year is "Embrace", a Bedford Charity giving support to families with children and young people with disabilities. Please be as generous as you have always been.

NEW ONLINE COMPETITION BOOKING SYSTEM

The Men's Competition Committee are introducing an online booking system for their competitions. Starting with the Life Member's Medal and Millennium Cup (for members who have paid for a 2, 3, 5, 10 or 15 year membership), which are due to be played on Sunday 23rd March, members will be able to book into competitions online via Master Scoreboard. The start sheet will open at 7am, 28 days prior to the competition (i.e. Sunday 23rd February for these competitions).

Entry Fees will remain payable on the day of the competition.

To enter online:

1. Login to Master Scoreboard
2. Select 'Future Competitions'
3. Click 'Future Competitions: Bookings & Start Sheets'
4. Select the Competition you want to enter
5. Press 'Book' on your preferred tee time or time block (depending on the booking requirements of the competition)

6TH HOLE RULING

After consultation with the Competition Committee, it has been decided to remove the Local Rule permitting the use of a provisional ball on the 6th Hole. The addition of this special local rule has caused much confusion and hasn't helped with speeding up play.

Therefore, from 1st February 2025, if your ball goes into the penalty area please follow Rule 17.1d of the R & A Rules of Golf:

17.1d Relief for Ball in Penalty Area

If a player's ball is in a penalty area, including when it is known or virtually certain to be in a penalty area even though not found, the player has these relief options, each for **one penalty stroke**:

(1) Stroke-and-Distance Relief. The player may play the original ball or another ball from where the previous stroke was made (see [Rule 14.6](#)).

(2) Back-on-the-Line Relief. The player may drop the original ball or another ball (see [Rule 14.3](#)) outside the penalty area, keeping the estimated point where the original ball last crossed the edge of the penalty area between the hole and the spot where the ball is dropped (with no limit as to how far back the ball may be dropped). The spot on the line where the ball first touches the ground when dropped creates a relief area that is one club-length in any direction from that point, **but** with these limits:

- Must not be nearer the hole than the estimated point where the original ball last crossed the edge of the penalty area, and
- May be in any area of the course except the same penalty area, **but**
- Must be in the same area of the course that the ball first touched when dropped.

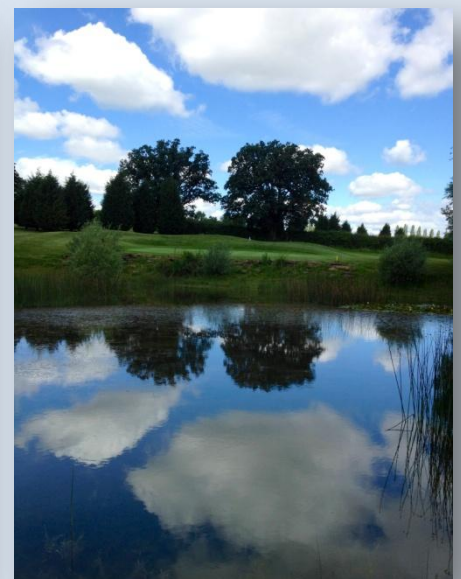
(3) Lateral Relief (Red Penalty Area). When the ball last crossed the edge of a red penalty area, the player may drop the original ball or another ball in this lateral relief area (see [Rule 14.3](#)):

Reference Point: The estimated point where the original ball last crossed the edge of the red penalty area.

Size of Relief Area Measured from Reference Point: Two club-lengths, **but** with these limits:

- Must not be nearer the hole than the reference point, and
- May be in any area of the course except the same penalty area, **but**
- If more than one area of the course is located within two club-lengths of the reference point, the ball must come to rest in the relief area in the same area of the course that the ball first touched when dropped in the relief area.

Players are no longer permitted to hit a provisional ball if they are unsure as to whether their ball is in the penalty area.
